**POSITION:** Childcare Provider

Our Childcare Provider helps uphold our values of Collaboration, Excellence, and Impact by providing a safe and comfortable environment in which children and youth can learn social and adaptive skills.*

**FUNCTION:** Reporting to the Advocacy Program Coordinator, The Childcare Provider is responsible for assisting the Advocates by providing support and care for child victims who come to the Children's Advocacy Center. The Childcare Provider provides opportunities and activities for structured and unstructured play, with a focus on trauma-informed care. The Childcare Provider also prepares and provides snacks or meals based on the need for evidence collection and/or time of day.

### **PRIMARY DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

Responsible for providing direct support for children and youth:

- Plan and arrange the lobby, teen room, and designated play areas;
- Provide a safe and fun learning environment for young children and youth;
- Ensure all designated areas are kept clean and tidy;
- Provide careful supervision with an eye to safety;
- Implement developmentally appropriate activities that advance coping skills;
- Assist with any special needs and provide adaptations for activities as needed;
- Guide children and youth in expressing themselves appropriately when needed;
- Implement activities to assist with calming children and youth experiencing distress;
- Plan, prepare, and provide snacks or meals, as approved by the Medical Team;
- Conduct surveys with children and youth regarding their experience at the Center.

Responsible for providing customer service to families and partners:

- Respond cheerfully to all reasonable requests for support made by parents/caregivers;
- Communicate any problematic behaviors to Advocates and the Crisis Counselor quickly;
- Interact positively with partner staff, offering support and demonstrating a desire on the part of The Center to exceed their expectations.

Other duties as assigned.

**QUALIFICATIONS:**

- High school degree required, with some college or technical schooling preferred
- One (1) year of experience in an early childhood education setting
- Experience working with survivors of trauma
- Demonstrated knowledge/training in Arizona Early Learning Guidelines and Standards
- Bilingual English/Spanish

**ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS:**

- Current immunization records
- Ability to follow directions and anticipate needs, taking initiative when needed
- Excellent communication skills, both verbally and in writing
- Comfortable working with families from diverse backgrounds
- Ability to maintain the confidentiality of sensitive information
- Must be able to pass a fingerprint and criminal background check
- Proof of freedom from tuberculosis required after hire
